White Gift Sunday December 8th, 2024

One of the traditions of the Church has been White Gift Sunday. White Gift Sunday is based on a Chinese legend that on the king's birthday the citizens would wrap gifts in white and bring their presents to the king. Being wrapped in the white paper, was a way of making them equal in the eyes of the beholder.

In a Methodist Church in Ohio in 1904, a minister's wife asked the congregation to wrap their gifts in white to prevent individuals and families from feeling ashamed of gifts that they brought to the Church's Christmas gift exchange. All gifts were to be seen as equal. Over the years White Gift Sunday has seen some changes. In the past, on White Gift Sunday, the Sunday School led the Worship service with a Christmas pageant. During the service the gifts were brought forward and then were used in the church hampers to be distributed to families that did not have much for Christmas.
